

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Discuss the morals of the stories, considering who was right and wrong, and why
- Consider the consequences of particular actions and words
- Gain awareness of and become more sensitive to the needs, views and feelings of others

Communication, and Literacy

- Stories include Jack and the Beanstalk, Little Red Riding Hood, The Gingerbread Man, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, The Enormous Turnip and a story from Chinese New Year celebrations
- Understand the elements of stories, such as main character, sequence of events and openings
- Retell narratives in the correct sequence and using story language
- Write for different purposes

Physical Development

- Develop their fine motor control through a variety of activities including handwriting
- Explore movement and creating routines in response to the traditional tales being taught
- exercise, healthy eating, sleeping and hygiene keep us healthy

- Respond to the traditional tales through creatively through art and design, role play, imaginative play, music and dance.
