

Say the sound out loud. (See sound mat below). Children to sing along to the tricky words song: Click link below: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R087l YrRpgY Read these tricky words together. Try and learn them. Once learnt, write down the tricky words on strips of paper. Hide them around the house. Child to go and find the tricky words. How many sausages can you see? How many bowls are there? Can you describe the patterns on the jars that are on the shelf? (Look at the shape and the colours). Today we are going to learn how to use a tens frame. Use two different colours to draw circles. See template sheet below. Challenge: Write a number sentence after using the tens frame. E.g. 5+5=10.	Lunch	Make your own playdough! Today you are going to have a go at making your own play dough. Work with your child to make their own playdough. Are they able to follow instructions? (See image below and follow instructions). Once you have made the playdough, can you squeeze, pinch, twist (See images below and copy). This will help improve children's fine motor skills, which will further help improve the strength in their fingers. This will help with holding a pencil and writing. Save the playdough for tomorrow's lesson. Place it in an air tight container.	Children to have a go at handwriting practise. Can you write these letters and words across your page making sure they are formed correctly. Always start from the top. Encourage children to not take their pencil off the page when writing each letter. See page below to look at today's handwriting session. Read the words. Copy the letters and the words. This can be done on plain paper if you do not have a printer. Please make sure your child is holding the pencil correctly. 














































Number Bonds: Tens Frame Colouring

No-Cook Playdough

Ingredients

- 2 cups plain flour
- 1 cup salt
- 1 tbsp oil
- 1 cup cold water
- 2 drops liquid food colouring – any colour of your choosing

What is kneading?

This is when you press, massage, squeeze and fold your dough.


Method


- Mix the flour and salt together in a large mixing bowl.
- Add the cold water, oil and drops of food colouring and mix together.
- When your ingredients are well mixed, take them out of your bowl and place your dough onto a flat surface, such as greaseproof paper.
- Knead vigorously for a few minutes, until your dough feels like playdough and all of the stickiness has gone.

If your dough is too wet, add a little extra flour and carry on kneading.

If your dough is too dry and crumbly, add an extra drop of cold water and carry on kneading.

Make sure you add any extra ingredients a little bit at a time.
