L.K: To create a wanted poster for your mythical creature

Yesterday, you discovered a mythical creature and listed all of it's key features. It was extremely helpful that you did this, as it's just escaped from the zoo! Now it's rampaging towards Birmingham and people need to be warned about how dangerous your creature is and what they must do in order to keep safe!

To do this, we need a wanted poster produced that includes all of the crucial information about your creature and informs people about what they must do now to stay safe. I've provided a template below that you can use if you want to, but you are also welcome to create your own and be as imaginative as you can be. You will need to include all of your information from yesterday in your poster. However, as it's something that should only be looked at quickly by the people you're trying to keep safe, you shouldn't write massive paragraphs. Instead, you need to summarise your information using subheadings and 2-3 sentences each.

For example, if I was to change my description from yesterday to something that is summarised it would be:

Yesterday:

The Crumple-Horned Snorkack is a dangerous member of the dragon family who has bright green, leathery wings and a razor-sharp set of 32 teeth. The Snorkack has this many teeth as its teeth are very brittle and snap off easily. Therefore, it needs to regrow this quickly and have spares to use in case of emergency! Its leathery wings can carry the Snorkack hundreds of miles at a time and reach a top speed of 275mph. Its zebra patterned body confuses its prey and enemies, making it a brilliant hunter of its main prey- the Seven-spotted Gorilla.

Today:

Description:

The Crumple-horned Snorkack is a dangerous dragon with green, leathery wings and a 32 sharp teeth in its mouth. It has a zebra patterned body and has been known to fly at 275mph! It's teeth are brittle, but make sure you don't get bitten as they are lethal!

Make sure that your poster is bright and eye-catching, so lots of people can see it and be warned! You need to make sure that you advise people of what they must do if they come into contact with your creature and how they can keep themselves safe!
