L.K: To write, illustrate, edit and improve our letter to a friend

Yesterday we completed the planning for a letter that you want to send to a friend in Year 4 that you haven't been able to see since we went into lockdown. You should have short sentences that are ready to be formed into paragraphs and more complex sentences. This should be quite easy, seeing as you have done most of the work yesterday, but it is CRUCIAL that you are reading your work through and editing and improving the following:

- Spelling
- Punctuation
- Grammar (does your work make sense?)
- Can you change words using a thesaurus to add more complicated vocabulary?
- Have you fully explained your point? Could it be better? This is your opportunity!

When you have checked your work you can form it into your paragraphs. This would be a good time to include fronted adverbials. If you can remember what they are, we did a lesson on them last week!

After you have written your letter, you can illustrate it with pictures, drawings and add colour to make it even better for your friend to read. This is a very important part of the letter writing process as it allows you to show how creative you are. Make sure it looks brilliant!

After you are done, if you want to, you can email me either a picture or a copy of your work and I will attempt to send it to your chosen friend. You need to make sure your picture is clear and readable so that your friend can read your work fully. If I cannot email it to your friend (as I don't have all of the emails for the class, but I do have most of them) I will keep a copy on my computer, print and laminate it once we get back to school. You can then give your letter to your friend at school.
