L.K: To read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12-hour clocks

We are moving onto recapping a new topic this week. The Topic will be Time and we looked at this back in February. Before we start, the key vocabulary for this Topic is below. It is crucial that you understand these terms as I will be using them a lot this week!

Time – A way of measuring how long something will take or how long has passed since a certain point. Measured simply using seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, months, years etc.

Clock – A way of telling the time. A clock can have hands that show seconds, minutes and hours or it can be digital and use numbers instead.

Analogue – A clock that has hands that show seconds, minutes and hours. This time is shown in the 12-hour format and uses terms like “quarter to” and “ten past”.

Digital – A way of showing time using numbers that are separated by a colon. “14:15” becomes “two fifteen”.

AM – This means that the time shown is in the morning. “AM” means before midday.

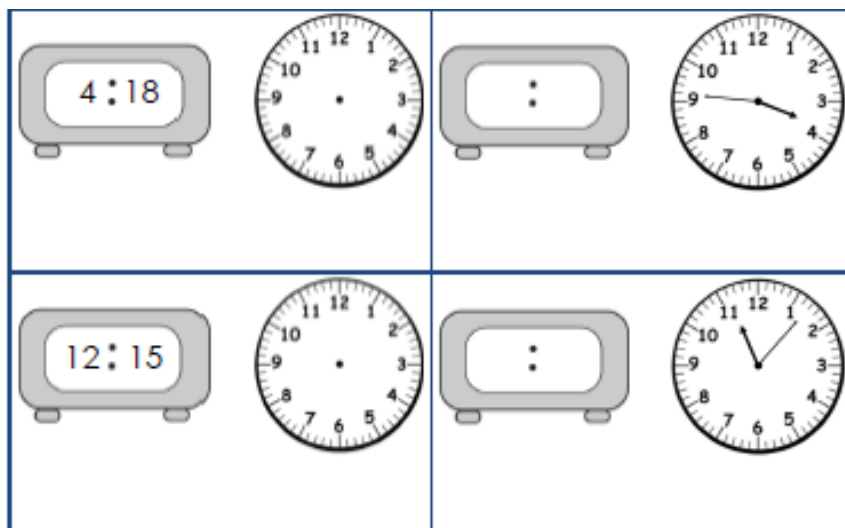
PM – This time would be in the afternoon. “PM” means past midday.

- 1) Ten AM
- 2) Eleven fifteen AM
- 3) Half past twelve in the afternoon
- 4) Half past three in the morning
- 5) Nine twenty five PM
- 6) Twenty to three in the morning

You will need to translate the time from digital to analogue or analogue to digital time.
